Outline -

Introducing traffic calming by implementing a oneway road system.

Benefits,

Increased pedestrian / driver safety.

Indroduction of Pedestrian Crossings/islands to enable safe pedestrian crossing points.

Enable better traffic flow into and out of business areas, housing estates.

Drivers becoming more pedestrian and locally environment aware.

Walking around town becomes more pedestrian friendly.

Enables footpaths, walkways to be widened.

Increased crossing points with better kerbside access.

Disadvantages,

Slower moving traffic, understandably causing some annoyance amongst residents and drivers, especially during peak periods.

Risk of too many traffic lights (should they be implemented) over a too shorter distance.

I am sure there are people with similar if not better ways of implementing these changes, but we all have to start somewhere.
